



entrance

A traditional gallery space at the entrance acts as a facade.

Pops of bright color lead into the rest of the exhibit space.





Scale is employed to recreate the act of looking up at buildings, while oversized benches and structures provided seating for moments of play or contemplation.



Beyond the last wall the exhibit extends outside the building.

Banksy's work is far from being about himself, so the final space here allows visitors to create their own works of art, reflecting on the experience and ideas presented.
